The successful candidate will assist the Faculty Scenographer (Designer for the Theatre, Department of Dramatic Arts)/Director of the Centre for Studies In Arts and Culture with his academic, production and creative research program, including the preparation of his work for the Mainstage productions of the Department of Dramatic Arts. The candidate may also participate in colloquia and presentations.

The successful candidate may assist with the research and preparation of the scenographic designs for the Fall 2011 season DART Mainstage production. (Alex Mclean, director: *The Triangle Shirtwaist Fire Trial.*) The successful candidate will assist the faculty supervisor with the preliminary organizational research as well as paper presentation research for the upcoming conference *Designing the Performance Spaces* (22 to 26 June, 2011, Prague CZ). This international conference coincides with the *Prague Quadrennial 2011*, and is prepared by the Arts and Theatre Institute Prague and the Faculty of Arts, Charles University in Prague, in association with the Scenography Working Group of the International Federation for Theatre Research (for whom the faculty supervisor is principle convener). Following the conference the successful candidate will assist with the preparation of a book volume of conference proceedings from this and an affiliated 2007 conference. The successful candidate may also assist with the preparation of conference proceedings and related articles and web-based media objects issuing from the Marilyn I Walker School of Fine and Performing Arts conference *Lyric Canada 2010* (October 2010, organized in cooperation with the Shaw Festival Theatre, Tapestry Opera (Toronto), Opera.ca, and Scriptlab (Toronto)) for publication in an upcoming 2011 issue of *The Brock Review*.

The successful candidate will also assist with academic research associated with the strategic planning of the Centre for Studies in Arts and Culture. Working with the Supervisor and the Editorial team the successful candidate will research and compile for the purposes of designing and building a 12 -24 unit e-learning experience for a foundation-level undergraduate and continuing education population pursuing studies with the Centre for Studies in Arts and Culture. (e-learning subject: An introduction to the history and contemporary trends of Niagara binational regional arts and culture with the purpose of advancing regional cultural and heritage literacy and capacity. Editorial Collaborators may include: cSTAC, VISA, IASC, Canadian Studies, Niagara Observatory, and other units of Brock University, St. Catharines and Area Arts Council, Niagara Artists Centre, City of St. Catharines, Niagara Region, etc. Technological collaborators may include Centre for Teaching, Learning and Educational Technologies (CTLET), Centre for Digital Humanities (CSH), among others.)

Responsibilities may include:

- to assist the faculty with preparatory research, reading, indexing, synthesis, analysis and reporting, drawing, drafting, and maquette building as required in the realization of design projects for theatre and the presentation of these materials as required (or a selected combination of the above), as well as the research, organization and editing or research presentations and conference proceedings

- to assist with the research and preparation of dossiers dealing with both the realization and teaching of performance theory, praxis, and design and stagecraft for the theatre

- to assist with theatrical and exhibition presentation(s) of the work of Brock students and faculty in internal and external venues

- to assist with the creative start-up of a new performance and creative research venture of the Department

The exact duties and responsibilities of the successful applicant will depend upon the qualifications and interests of the applicant. Limited travel may be required to gather research material for Brock-related projects but most of the tasks are campus studio, theatre, and office-based.

The supervisor is an Associate Professor in the Department of Dramatic Arts, recipient of the 2009 Faculty Award for Excellence in Teaching, the Director for the Centre for Studies in Arts and Culture of the Marilyn I. Walker School of Fine and Performing Arts, and the Past Chair of the Culture Committee of the City Council of St. Catharines.

Qualifications:

- Facility with logical organization of ideas in text, including pre-publishing editing of conference presentations and proposed book submissions

- Facility with web and other image and text-based research is required

- Familiarity with computers, web presence, and digital imaging equipment and their set-up and operation is required

- Facility with some software applications is required (e.g. Photoshop, 3-D rendering programs, CAD-based drawing programs, video editing and processing, web page design and maintenance, as well as word-processing, spreadsheet, and other office applications, also RefWorks or similar bibliographic management system, or a combination of the above)
